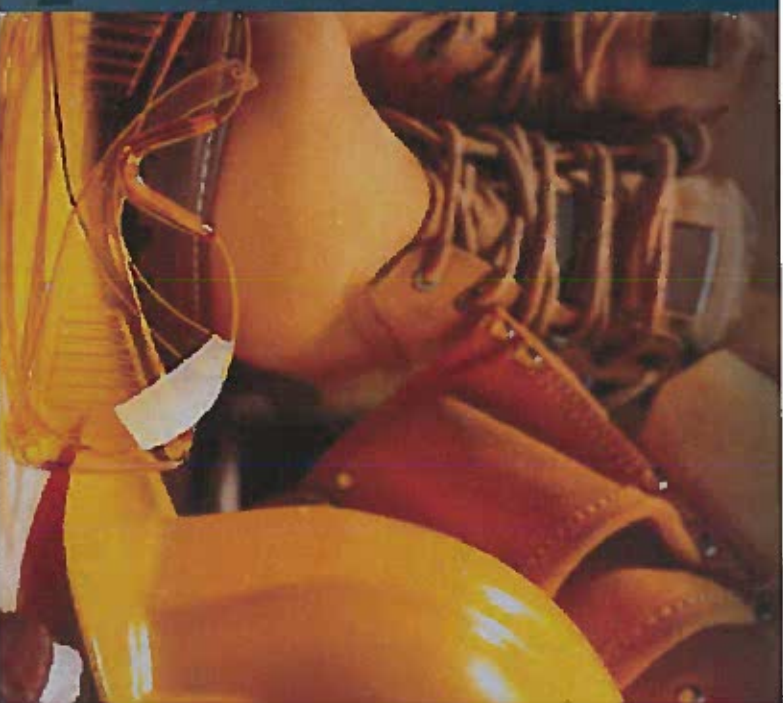

PARTNERS IN APPRENTICESHIP

Every year ABC Central Ohio trains over 250 individuals in the trades. The apprenticeship program is registered with the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship Training, Employer and Labor Services (OATELS) and the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council (OSAC). The program is open to all individuals who meet basic requirements.

APPRENTICES:

- Work full-time throughout the year
 - Advance in their careers through on-the-job training and classroom instruction
 - Earn college credit attending evening classes
 - Receive a Certificate of Completion as a qualified Journey person from the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council and U.S. Department of Labor upon completion of the program
- Journey persons may choose to advance into careers as supervisors, project managers, architects, estimators, and company owners.



STEPS TO EARNING YOUR ASSOCIATE DEGREE

- Step 1: Complete your Apprenticeship Training
- Step 2: Send any other College Transcripts to Columbus State for Evaluation
- Step 3: Complete Reading, Writing, & Math Placement Testing
- Step 4: Register for and Complete the 10 additional courses needed for Graduation
- Step 5: Petition to Graduate, your final semester
- Step 6: Attend Commencement, with other College Graduates

PARTNERSHIP MAJORS:

Electrician, Carpentry, Electronics Systems Technician, HVAC, and Plumbing.



TUITION COST:

Apprenticeship Technical courses are Free. The remaining courses are often paid for by employers or apprenticeship scholarships.



FACTS:

You will earn 30 Technical Credit hours during your apprenticeship (1/2 of an Associate's Degree). With as little as 10 additional college courses, you can complete a degree, specific to your trade. By completing 1-2 Courses per semester, you could graduate in as little as 5 semesters.
